

# EBOOKS:

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### Are ebooks downloadable?

Most of the time, yes. Sometimes a vendor provides ebooks to us in PDF chapter format. In this case you can download the chapter to any Adobe-compatible device. Be aware that only newer Mac products support the Adobe Reader. Download the free [Bluefire Reader](#) app to use on your ipad or iphone.

The **EBSCO** ebook collection and **ebrary** titles require you to download the Adobe Digital Editions tool. Detailed instructions for doing this can be found at <http://www.adobe.com/solutions/ebook/digital-editions/download.html>.

If you are downloading a book in **EBSCO**, you will need to sign up for a free account. The link to do this is on the top right of the page. Click on "Sign In" then look at the left of the Login button and click on "Create a new Account."

### Why can't I get access to an ebook we own?

There are different types of ebooks: single-user, three-user, and multiple-user. Multiple-user titles allow an unlimited number of people to access them at the same time. Three-user titles allow only three people to access the book at the same time. Finally, single-user titles mean just that, only one person can access the book at a time. Most of the titles in the **EBSCO eBook Collection** and **ebrary** are multiple-user. The detailed record of the book will include its "Availability" (ebrary) or "Concurrent User Level" (EBSCO).

If a title comes up as "not available" you can put a hold on it and be notified when it has been "returned."

### Can I "return" a single or three-user ebook?

YES! And it's appreciated if you would because it makes the book available to other users that much faster. There is currently no option to return books in the **EBSCO eBook Collection** database. They are hoping to add this enhancement in the future. Most often, once someone closes out of a book from the viewer (not from a downloaded book) the book will be available in about 45 minutes or less.

A downloaded **ebrary** book will expire at the end of the download period and will be rendered unusable at that time.

You don't need to return downloaded books, but since you can only have ten downloaded ebrary books at a time, you might want to return one early so you can download another. And returning the download of a limited-user book will make it available to others on your ebrary site.

**To return an ebook early:**

1. Open **Adobe Digital Editions** or **Bluefire**
2. Right-click the book, select **"Return Borrowed Item"**

Note, returns may take up to an hour to be recognized on your ebrary site.

Downloaded books have the following checkout periods:

**EBSCO:** 14 days                      **ebrary:** 14 days

**Who provides our ebooks to us?**

Here is a list of our ebook vendors and the type of information you can find on their site:

**EBSCO** – Provides ebooks through [PsycBOOKS](#) (psychology titles) and the [eBook Academic Collection](#) database (135,000+ titles covering a variety of subjects).

[ebrary](#) – Provides over 125,000 titles, again covering a variety of subjects.

**Reference Books:** You can access background information on a variety of subjects by visiting the following databases: [Gale Virtual Reference Library](#); [SAGE Research Methods Online](#); and [Credo Reference](#).

**How can I find an ebook?**

You can search for most of our ebooks in our library catalog <https://baypath.on.worldcat.org/discovery>. You can also visit specific vendor web pages to search within their collections. (See **Who provides our ebooks to us?** for specifics)

If you search for a book in the library catalog - Do a search as usual and use the left-hand column to limit your search results to ebooks. You could also do an Advanced Search and limit to ebook from the Format drop down menu before you start your search. Click the "View Now" link to be directed to the full text of the book.

**Can I print an ebook?**

You can't print the whole book but you can print a certain number of pages. The exact number of pages varies depending on the database provider and any copyright restrictions from the publisher. Usually, you can see how many changes you can print in the details about the book.
